<u>PD Update</u> – Violent Treat Risk Assessment (VTRA) training was received by Andrea, Damion, Justin and Ron. This training is geared toward evaluating and taking preventative safety measures. Teachers have received training on Universal Design for Learning (UDL). The guiding principle of UDL is with firm goals, all students have the means to experience success.

<u>Registration</u> – 2025-2026 Registration has been completed. Many thanks to Ms. Meek for her assistance. Our admin team made many personal phone calls to ensure correct placements were made for each student bound for Lockview next year.

<u>Presentations</u> – African Heritage Month: Keante Beals spoke to all grade 6's on his book titled, I Am Brave. Students participated in a performance from an African Nova Scotian band and storytelling group. We had daily trivia announcements on African Canadian History and a daily message of Black Excellence was read on the announcements daily. The grade 7's attended a field trip to Africville and the Grade 8's went to Pier 21. Mr. Merrick spoke to several grade 7 social studies students about Nora Bernard, the honouree for Heritage Day.

School Community – There will be a school dance on April 17 (following the SAC meeting). GPV hosted a wonderful Showcase performance from a wide variety and inclusive set of students. Many thanks to Mr. Crawford and GPV staff for his leadership and dedication to Showcase. GPV had a fun and lively spirit week prior to March Break where classes participated for points (staff toddler pictures, scavenger hunt, dressing (sports, for example) competition for a chance to win a class pizza party, ice-cream or treats. Many thanks to Ms. Arsenault and Ms. Kelly for running these events. We have worked with Constable Turco who presented about online safety.
